

Recycling in the Village in provided by our garbage hauler **Tim's Trucking (608)643-8760**.

Recyclables to be handled as follows:

<u>**Plastic</u>**- #1-#7 rinsed, caps removed and bagged. NO plastic shopping bags! Milk cartons, detergent containers, and other such items can be tied together and placed next to the bag.</u>

Glass (all colors)- rinsed, caps removed and bagged.

Aluminum & Tin- rinsed and bagged.

Aerosol cans- caps removed and bagged.

<u>Newspapers & Magazines</u>- bundled and tied securely. No more than 10" high.

<u>Cardboard</u>- must be flattened and tied securely. No more than 10" high.

Batteries (lead acid)- must be placed beside the recycle bags.

**All recyclables are to be placed in clear plastic bags. Glass, tin, aerosol cans and aluminum can be bagged together.

You must contact Tim's Trucking to make arrangements for pick-up of items such as, appliances, furniture, etc. There is a separate charge for these items, which will be billed to the property owner. Wal-Mart in Baraboo will take used oil for recycling. **DO NOT** throw it in the garbage or dumpster, the landfill will not accept it.

<u>Medications</u>- over the counter and prescription <u>Kitchen Waste</u>- grease, unwanted cooking oil, coffee grounds <u>Diapers</u>- cloth, cotton, paper, plastic, or disposable <u>Cigarette Butts</u> <u>Personal Care Products</u>- sanitary napkins, tampons, condoms, panty liners <u>Trash & Scrap</u>- cotton swabs, dental floss <u>Kitty Litter</u> <u>Paper Towels & Facial Tissue</u> <u>Dirt</u>- (large amounts) <u>Chemicals</u>- Photo chemicals, paints, thinners, oils, varnishes, pesticides, used motor oil <u>Toys and other items not meant to be flushed</u>

**Sump Pumps should not be connected to the sanitary sewer system per Village Ordinance 116-5 (3) (a) and Department of Natural Resources regulations.
